A FEW WORDS FROM PASTOR RON

I've decided to go back to school this summer. I always attend a couple of quality continuing edu-

cation events each year to "sharpen the saw" as Stephen Covey calls it, but this year I decided to take an actual academic class. At a recent conference, I met and talked to a scholar I have admired for many years. Amy-Jill Levine is an Orthodox Jew, a New Testament scholar, a brash New Englander who has lived for thirty years in the south, and an amazing teacher.

When I met her, she invited me to take her graduate-level course on the Gospel of Matthew. When a world-class scholar invites you to take her class, well, you just gotta do it, right? So much of June has had me in class. Real class. You know, the kind you have to be on time for. The kind that has an 8-page syllabus. The kind that has LOTS of reading and assignments with deadlines.



As I expected, the class has been both challenging and incredibly enriching. Here are a few things I have come away with so far:

First, I've been reminded of the deep roots of our faith. In Matthew, the Old Testament is quoted repeatedly. Matthew was writing for both Jews and Gentiles, but he was insistent that his readers remember that the Jesus story is not a NEW story, but a completion of a story that started long ago. The story of Israel is OUR story, too.

Second, I've learned how meaningful it can be when people of different faiths engage one another openly and gracefully about their religious experiences. In addition to the instructor being an Orthodox Jew, there are several Muslim students in the class. Their questions and challenges and informative information about Islam and the Quran remind me that the only thing that stands in the way of respect and understanding is our hardened hearts and narrow minds.

I've learned a few others thing, too, like the meaning of metalepsis and Masoretic cantillation (Look at me showing off!), but mostly I've learned—once again—how much I love God's story told in the Bible and the joy of studying it with others, even those whose faith is different from my own. I think that's the way God intended it.

I'll see you in church this weekend!

ICDI SNACK COLLECTION

We have all heard the news about busloads of refugees arriving in Chicagoland. Together with the Illinois Community for Displaced Immigrants (ICDI), Epiphany members are asked to do a small bit to help these people. Oftentimes families have traveled on a bus for days without access to food. The Chicago Immigrant Transit Assistance arm (CITA) of ICDI provides hot meals and snack packs at the Chicago Greyhound bus station.

In July, Epiphany will begin an ongoing collection of snack items to make the prescribed snack packs for immigrants arriving in Chicago. Please bring your donations of healthy, individually packed snacks to the marked bin in the Epiphany Center anytime. Items that can be donated for snack packs include dried fruits, nuts, protein/breakfast bars, chips and/or pretzels, apple sauce (squeezable packs work best), and cookies. We will assemble our snack packs and deliver them as donations come in.




