“Wild Life!” Vacation Bible School at Epiphany




Monday, June 19 – Thursday, June 22, 6-8 p.m.

A FEW WORDS FROM PASTOR RON

On the next page, you will see Bill Edwards' letter informing you about our financial situation and encouraging you to prayerfully consider your gifts toward God's work at Epiphany.

When your congregation leadership recommended the 2023 budget, we knew it would be a challenge. For the first time in many years, we carry significant debt. We believed then—and still do—that Epiphany is up to the challenge. When we presented the budget, we promised that we would keep you informed about our progress toward meeting the budget.



Here's what your leadership is doing to address the issue:

- We are negotiating the refinancing of our mortgage to a longer term. The mortgage is now amortized for a duration of 10 years. That's a little more aggressive than we had planned, but we wanted to take advantage of the low interest rates and get the debt paid off a little quicker. Pat Jones, our treasurer, is negotiating a longer period and lower monthly mortgage payments.
- The staff and Congregation Council are carefully monitoring expenditures and working to keep spending below budget levels until things improve.
- We have postponed our offerings to the Metropolitan Chicago Synod and the ELCA. We expect to catch up on our budgeted amount to share in the mission of the wider church, but we are postponing our payments temporarily to help with the cash flow.

Here's what you can do:

- Please check your records to see if you are current on your estimate of giving. If you are behind, please consider catching up.
- If you are up to date with your giving estimate, perhaps you could consider increasing your level of giving. Did you receive a large tax refund or a bonus at work? Consider designating a portion of that to God's work at Epiphany.
- Please consider your level of giving over the last several years. Have you been giving the same amount? (We have found that members who give electronically are less likely to increase their giving from year to year.) Inflation has affected the church as it has individuals and families. Would you consider giving Epiphany a mid-year "raise"?
- Are you new to Epiphany and have not yet begun to share in the mission of the congregation through your financial gifts? Perhaps regular giving would be the next step in your active engagement.

You should know that we are not in a financial crisis. God has still blessed Epiphany with abundance. We have plenty of cash, and the bills are being paid. We simply need to increase gifts to meet the challenging goals we made for ourselves in 2023. These are exciting times to be the church. I believe that God has given us all that we need to do what we're called to do here. I pray that you do, too.

THOUGHTS FROM BILL EDWARDS

Bill Edwards, a member of the Congregation Council and the Stewardship Committee shares some thoughts about our giving to Epiphany's mission.

To my fellow Epiphany Church family members,

We need your help. At a recent Congregation Council meeting, we learned that our projected giving is running behind our budget projections. At the same time, our expenses have held true compared to our objectives. While the first two months of the year were strong due to some initial gifts, the last two months (March and April) show concerning deficits. (See chart below.)

The fact that we are running behind can be attributed to a number of reasons, and not one of them can be fixed easily. To address the problem now, we are asking everyone to try to offer a little more in your personal stewardship estimate for the balance of this year. Our ability to meet the needs of our congregational family and be a resource to our community starts with our personal commitments.

We all know Epiphany does great things in our own lives and for our community. Your support is appreciated and valued, but we need a little more at the moment.
